





STEP #2

Cut out dotted keyboards and laminate enough so each child has one.
(If you wish, make enough for each child to have two keyboards since there will be an activity in a later Step that requires that each child have two.)

Cut apart the dotted keyboards. Make enough so each child receives one keyboard.
Again, they will need two of these in a later Step.

ACTIVITIES

Each activity becomes progressively more difficult, so stay on each activity long enough for the children to become comfortable before moving on. At this point just use the right hand. (Let your "leftie" kids know their time is coming!) If the children have a problem finding the keys in #4 and #5, show them the keys on the little 2 black key and 3 black key cards so they "see" the groups more clearly on the 5 black key group of keys.

#1: Give each child a dotted keyboard.

Call out either "pink" or "blue" and have children touch the correspondingly colored dot with their "pink" or "blue" right hand finger.

#2: While singing through the Tick Tock song with colors have children touch the properly colored dot with their properly colored finger.
(Use the audio part of the Tick Tock video with KK singing the colors so children can sing along with her if you wish.)

#3. When they are able, while singing through Tick Tock with words have children touching the proper keys with their proper fingers.

#4. Using the undotted keyboard, have children find the key that is colored pink for Tick Tock.

Find that 3 black key group.

The "pink" Tick Tock key is one of the white keys in the middle - the one on the left.

#5. Using the undotted keyboard, have children find that "blue" Tick Tock key.

Find the 2 black key group.

The "blue" Tick Tock key is outside on the left.

#6. Try singing and tapping through Tick Tock like #2 and #3 with the undotted keyboard.
