We are transitioning into notation big time now....mainly because the notes "show" the shape of the song. And, changes in hand position are also more visible with notation. Notation with fingering in the middle of the grand staff will remain for awhile, however.

Fingering on the keystrip is also changing from color coded to just black. Little hands will still be color coded. When dealing with young beginners be sure to always say "Left hand blue finger 5" so they continue to react to the proper hand and to the fingering, not just the color so eventually we will just need to use fingering. If you need to still mark the piano/keyboard keys with color it is fine. We are trying to enstill muscle memory - and if young students still need colors to use the correct fingering, so be it. Just take a little bit away at a time....make the colors you use smaller, "choose a color not needed" to take away, etc.


Talk about those notes a lot. And....be working on those Silly Songs a lot. Even look at other piano music and figure out some of the notes seen there. Children gain much confidence when they know how to do something - like figuring out a note they haven't even seen before just by counting up and down those lines and spaces, then finding the proper key.

Sing the song a lot...then sing and play when possible. "I will not for-get, no I will not for-get that Je-sus is my lov-ing Sav-ior! Thank you Lord, thank you Lord. Thank you for lov-ing me!"






What is totally different about these lines is that the right hand slides 4 keys to the right! Finger 5 is on a higher C! WOW!

Be sure to hold down the key for 2 beats for those half notes.




Notice the arrows pointing down and the arrows pointing toward the left. The left hand slides to the left one key for this part. LH finger 5 will be playing on a B, not a C! This may be a bit difficult - tell students to be patient with their hands. Had to add a key to the keystrip!! Also notice those little quarter rests - NO sound for those beats!..key up.



Discuss the measures and counting 1&2&3&4& in order to play those 8th notes correctly. Notes take up much less room than big finger numbers in boxes! - and tell us a lot!


