





## FINGER COLOR REMINDER GAME

Another game for reinforcing the finger colors!  
This one concentrates on using both hands, not just one.  
Tiny Hands Finger Color Reminders may be used until the games are played with ease.

### Game 1:

The "Card Person" has many cards in a stack, all upside down.  
Card Person takes the top card and shows it to everyone.  
All players touch the table with right hand and left hand fingers that match the color on the card shown.  
Each player checks the player next to him/her to make sure proper fingers are touching the table.  
Card Person goes through all the cards one at a time.  
Object of the game is to go through the cards as fast as possible while keeping accuracy on the part of the players.

### Game 2:

Each player has 5 cards - one of each color.  
One player turns his/her cards upside down, mixes them up then turns them over and places in a row.  
Each player then places his/her cards in the same order.  
The first player names the colors left to right as the players "finger march" through the colors by touching the table with the proper fingers of each hand.  
Again...object is accuracy and increasing speed of play.

Game 3: This is a game that can be played by one person alone that is using 5 cards - one of each finger color.  
Player turns cards face down.  
Player mixes them up then turns cards right side up.  
Player places cards in a row, then touches the table with the proper fingers of each hand matching the colors from left to right.  
Player then mixes up the cards and finger marches in a different order.

Cut out color dot cards.

Also cut out cards sized 2 inches by 3 inches on colored paper.

(Make all these cards the same color so cards look identical when face down.)

Glue dot cards to one side of larger colored cards. Laminate.

For ease in lamination, the sample cards were laminated in "Wallet Size" laminate. (2-1/2 x 3-3/8)

Cut around My Tiny Hands. Laminate, leaving a laminate edge around the hands.  
The hands will also fit within Wallet Size laminate if you want to turn them into "cards" as well.
