







GIANT EIGHTH NOTES

Trim a space around eighth notes...

Laminate, then cut about a quarter to half inch away from your trimmed shape. Make sure your laminate shape keeps the “flashcard” stable...ie. don't cut up between double eighth notes.

These are called eighth notes.

They look like quarter notes with a flag on them.

They do go twice as fast as quarter notes,
so we say they get to run run run.

Sometimes we say walk **and** walk **and** walk **and**

That way we play the eighth notes the correct speed. We just have to remember to say the “walk” part the speed of a quarter note.

All notes can be written right side up and upside down.

That flag flips to the inside when the note goes upside down....looks quite different that way!

When two or more eighth notes are in a row that flag blows straight out and looks like a banner between the notes. The flag on the last note disappears!

These eighth notes like to look different every time something changes a little bit - upside down - more than one in a row.....
