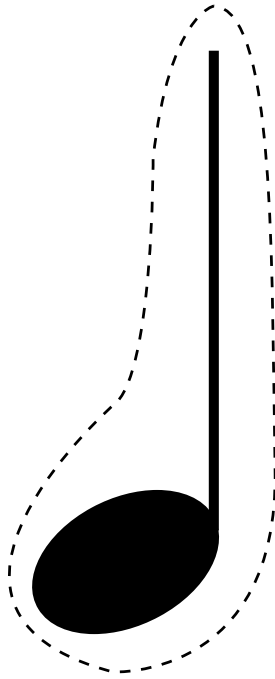


QUARTER NOTE WALK WALK GAME



Cut around notes like dotted lines.
Laminate.
Cut a quarter to half inch out from
trimmed edges.

Give each child a laminated quarter note.

Review what quarter notes do - just walk walk walk!

Using the green grass strips with the shoe prints on them,
have the children tap along the shoe prints while
you and they say "walk, walk, walk, walk".

Try to get the children to tap carefully - right on those
shoe prints and when the word "walk" is said.

Sometimes, particularly if the children are really young,
you may have to tape down the green grass strips.

SHOE PRINTS

Laminate, trim off white edges, then cut the 3 sets of shoe prints apart so you have 3 sets with four shoe prints each.

If you want laminate around each side, just cut apart before laminating and slightly spread the sets apart. Trim to your liking.

These shoe prints are used with “walking” notes and rests.

Just have the students put their laminated note or rest onto the first shoe print, then “walk” along the prints according to the type of note or rest they are holding.

ie. If they have quarter notes, they just move one step at a time as you clap for each beat.

walk walk walk walk

If you have half notes: Again, clap for the beats.

walk wait (don't move!) walk wait

If you have quarter rests:

Clap softly and as they move they say Shhhh.

Shhh Shhh Shhh Shhh

Also mix up the notes and rests as they learn about them.

So quarter note, half note, quarter note, quarter note would be: walk, walk wait, walk, walk
